• Issue: The CEC have tabled some very specific concessions which create a two-tiered system, placing trades/apprenticeship, academic upgrading and others all under the guise of 'flexibility' with the goal to 'modernize'. Two tiering of workload protections aims to further marginalize the faculty who are already facing inequitable workload pressures by increasing even more work assigned to them.
